






Knowledge Alliances: main objectives

Knowledge Alliances can focus on:


- jointly developing and implementing new learning and teaching methods (like new multidisciplinary curricula, learner-centred and real problem-based teaching and learning)
- organising continuing educational programmes and activities with and within companies





Knowledge Alliances can focus on:

- creating schemes of transversal skills learning and application throughout higher education programmes developed in cooperation with enterprises aiming at strengthening employability, creativity
- embedding entrepreneurship education in any discipline to provide students, researchers, staff and educators with the knowledge, skills
- opening up new learning opportunities through the practical application of entrepreneurial skills, which can involve and/or lead to the commercialisation of new services, products and prototypes.





Knowledge Alliances can focus on:

Stimulating the flow and exchange of knowledge between higher education and enterprises:

- **study field** related activities in enterprises which are fully embedded in the curriculum,
- set-ups to trial and test innovative measures,
- exchanges of students, researchers, teaching staff and company staff for a limited period.




